Public Levee Access

Not all levees are publically owned. Some levees are located on private property and RD784 personnel can only access private property because the State of California holds easement rights for levee maintenance and operations.

RD784 cannot give permission for anyone to trespass on private property of another. The following list of levees is provided for information on which levees are open to the <u>public for pedestrian access only.</u>

Unauthorized Motor Vehicles are prohibited on all levees.

1. Western Pacific Interceptor Canal (Unit 4) – All private property except the first half mile North of Plumas Arboga Rd. to the beginning of the waterside shelf boundary fence which is owned by Sacramento San Joaquin Drainage District (SSDD).

Access from Old Marysville Road at Plumas Arboga Road.

- 2. Bear River Levee (Unit 3A Urban) WPIC west to Highway 70— Owner Sacramento San Joaquin Drainage District (SSDD). Open to the public: No motorized vehicles. Access from the Jamison Creek Way.
- 3. Bear River Levee (Unit 3A Urban and Unit 8) West of Hwy. 70 to the Feather River Levee- Owner Three Rivers Levee Improvement Authority (TRLIA). No motorized vehicles. Access at the south end of County Road 512.
- 4. Bear River To Star Bend/ Unit 2B Owner TRLIA and Sacramento San Joaquin Drainage District (SSDD).

Access is at the Bear River or Star Bend.

5. Star Bend/Unit 9 To Linda Water District/Unit 2A – Owner – TRLIA. Access is at Star Bend or the Broadway Gate.

6. Riverside To Shad Pad/Unit 1 - Owner - SSDD and TRLIA.

Access is at the Shad Pad.

7. Shad Pad To Simpson Lane/Unit 1 – Owner – SSDD.

Access is at the Shad Pad and at Simpson Lane.

8. Simpson Lane To Dantoni Road/Unit 1 – Owner – SSDD and TRLIA. Access is at Simpson Lane.

Dantoni Road/Unit 1 To Goldfields/Unit 7 – Owner – SSDD and TRLIA.
 Access Dantoni Road.

10. Horseshoe Levees/ Rural Units 3, 5, and 6 – All Privately Owned. No Public Access.
